

Parks & Recreational Facilities Safety Tips:


- Stay away from crowds. Visit parks and campgrounds that allow you to stay at least 6 feet away from others that you do not live with.
- Check with the park or campground to ensure bathroom accessibility and supplies needed to maintain proper hygiene.
- Wear a cloth face mask as often as possible around others. Do not allow children younger than 2 to wear a mask.
- Do not use playground equipment, pools, hot tubs or water slides unless they are being cleaned and maintained properly.

DIY (NO SEW) **CLOTH MASK**

Wear cloth face coverings in public settings where other social distancing measures are difficult to maintain, such as grocery stores, pharmacies, and gas stations to protect yourself and others around you this summer.


Materials:

Bandana, old t-shirt, or square cotton cloth (cut approximately 20"x20") Rubber bands (or hair ties) Scissors (if you are cutting your own cloth)






Fold top down. Fold bottom up.



Place rubber bands or hair ties about 6 inches apart.

Make sure your cloth face covering:

- fits snugly but comfortably against the side of the face
- completely covers the nose and mouth
- is secured with ties or ear loops
- includes multiple layers of fabric
- allows for breathing without restriction
- can be laundered and machine dried without damage or change to shape








Fold side to the middle and tuck.





WHO SHOULD NOT WEAR A MASK

- Children under age 2
- Anyone who has trouble breathing, or is unconscious, incapacitated or otherwise unable to remove the mask without assistance
